

- Not automatically recording all broadcast output on BoB is a decision. Storage has costs – both financial and environmental.
- Duplication can mean a waste of server space. Do all A/V assets need a centralised home?
- Is it better to host your A/V materials fully in-house, fully externally, or employ a mixture of the two? Will a custom-made system reinvent the wheel?
- Large databases pose significant challenges to creating an effective search function. Artificial Intelligence can help, but ensure it is fit for purpose for the task.
